- Jumpstart your new journey as a Bayhawk!



WELCOME TO THE BAY AREA

San Francisco Bay University welcomes students from all around the world, and we want to ensure that you get to campus safely. Use the following information as a guide to when developing your travel plans.






If you are flying in, please note that we have **three airports** that serve **domestic and international** flights:

#1 San Jose Mineta INTL (SJC): 10.2 miles

#2 San Francisco Bay Oakland INTL (OAK): 24.3 miles

#3 San Francisco INTL (SFO): 34.2 miles

We recommend SJC due to its proximity, but OAK and SFO may offer more affordable flights. All three airports can get you to campus with public transportation. When you land, please text your Enrollment Counselor to tell them you're on the way to campus. This way, we will expect you and can be ready to welcome you when you get here.



We *highly* recommend arriving on campus via Rideshare services such as Uber or Lyft.


If you fly into SFO or OAK, the most affordable way to get to campus will be through taking the <u>Bay Area Rapid Transit (BART)</u>. If you fly into SJC, taking an Uber or Lift directly to campus is most convenient.

Below, we have also included BART options:

<u>For students flying into SFO</u>, the travel time from BART to the closest stop to campus is long. You will need to take an Uber or a public bus south to campus from your final stop, Warm Springs Bart, Fremont.

• **Time:** 1.5+ Hours


• Cost: \$18-\$30+, depending on if you finish your trip by bus or Uber



<u>For students flying into OAK</u>, the travel time from BART to the closest stop to campus is relatively quick. You will need to take an Uber or a public bus south to campus from your final stop, Warm Springs Bart, Fremont.


• **Time:** ~1 Hr

• Cost: \$15-\$25, depending on if you finish your trip by bus or Uber



<u>For students flying into SJC</u>, the travel time to campus is quick. If you choose to take an Uber, it will take about 15 minutes. If you choose to take public transportation, it will take a little longer.

- Time: 15 minutes to an hour and a half
- Cost: \$5-\$40, depending on your mode of travel.

The Let'sTALK Program is a holistic approach to establishing an environment of trust, understanding and support to encourage open and safe conversations. Select students and staff were trained Fall 2024 to be able to tell when someone has a concern and to listen and talk with that person with empathy and gratitude in order to help them feel seen, heard, and valued. Staff are designated as mentors and students are designated as peers and can be identified by a pink bracelet or Let'sTALK pin.



SFBU Counseling Services offers a safe, judgment-free, and confidential space to talk one-on-one with a mental health professional to address concerns that can interfere with academics, wellness, or personal or professional growth. FREQUENTLY ASKED Q&As

When is New Student Orientation?

There is programming from Thursday, January 9th through Friday, January 10th. Both days are mandatory.

When does the Spring 2025 semester begin?

The Spring 2025 semester and classes begin on Monday, January 13th.

If I have on-campus housing, when is the earliest I can move in?

Move-in day for students with on-campus housing is Wednesday, January 8th. Students can check their email and the <u>SFBU Residential Life page</u> on the website for more information.

Do students receive a public transportation card?

All full-time SFBU students are eligible for the AC Transit SFBU EasyPass - the annual bus pass that allows students to go anywhere AC Transit goes - anytime! Passes are distributed to eligible students who have registered and signed the Pass Acceptance Form.

Note: BART passes are purchased separately and can be acquired at a local station, the closest being the Warm Springs/Fremont BART.

For parents & family: How can I learn more about the academic programs and resources available for my student? You are welcome to review academic program details here.

For parents & family: Who do I talk to if I have concerns about my student? Email <students-affairs@sfbu.edu> for non-emergency concerns. If you believe your student is in imminent danger, please call 9-11. You can also join the official Parents and Family Facebook group or WhatsApp group to swap advice, ask questions, and/or build community.

When will I receive my Student ID Card?

During New Student Orientation, you will have your photo taken. Your Student ID will be ready for pick-up during the first week of classes.

Is there an Add/Drop period for classes?

You can add or drop classes from Monday, January 13th until Saturday, January 18th.

How does SFBU maximize campus safety?

A security guard is on-site before standard business hours and remains throughout the evening classes. I'm struggling with Math / English in particular. Is there someone I can see?

Yes! Evelyn Binoya <evelyn.binoya@sfbu.edu> is our Student Academic Success Specialist for Mathematics and Leslie Ji <leslie.ji@sfbu.edu> is our Student Academic Success Specialist for English. They both offer tutoring hours, study sessions, and workshops to help you excel in these subjects.

I need information about student activities, clubs, or organizations. Where do I go?

You should check in with Michael Leinhos <michael.leinhos@sfbu.edu> for student life and activities. He can help you learn about all the clubs and activities on campus and get you involved!

I'm looking for internships, training, or job opportunities. Who can assist me?

You can talk to Ogai Zemarialai <ogai.zemarialai@sfbu.edu>. As a specialist in Career Services, she's there to help you find internships and job opportunities and can guide you through the process. She offers guidance on resumes, cover letters, and even conducts mock interviews! Ogai can also assist you with arranging CPT (Curricular Practical Training) and OPT (Optional Practical Training).

I need assistance with disability or access services. Who can I speak to?

You can talk to Margaux John <margaux.john@sfbu.edu>, our Coordinator for Disability and Accessibility Services. She can help address your needs and provide the support you're looking for!

I'm having issues with my housing. Who should I contact?

You should reach out to Jason Sjah <housing@sfbu.edu> in Housing. He can help you with any housing concerns or questions you may have.

What if I'm still not sure who to see?

If you're uncertain, feel free to ask at the Front Desk. Our Front Desk staff are always available to direct you to the right place!

Key Personnel in the Main Administrative Building

I'm unsure who to talk to about adding or dropping classes and course selection. Who should I see?

For anything related to registration, you should reach out to Judy Weng <judy.weng@sfbu.edu>, our Registrar. She handles course selection and scheduling, keeps track of student academic records and transcripts, and manages graduation applications. She is also the primary contact for verifying degree requirements, conducting degree audits, and issuing diplomas. To schedule a meeting with Judy, visit the Front Desk, where our Front Desk Receptionist, Lesley Jimenez, can set up a time for you.

I need a copy of my transcript or my diploma. How can I get help with either of these?

There are a lot of resources on the student portal that can help with this, such as submitting a request for a transcript, physical or digital. Gladys Wu, our Assistant Registrar, can help from there! You can pick up your transcript from her 1-2 business days after your request is received. She also handles diploma pickup and physical notarized or official documents required for your student record.

I'm looking for information on visas and immigration issues. Who should I see?

You should connect with Jessie Dhamrait <jessie.dhamrait@sfbu.edu>, our Designated School Official. She's here to help students with visa applications and immigration status, as well as advising students on academic and immigration-related issues. To schedule a meeting with Jessie, visit the Front Desk, where our Front Desk Receptionist, Lesley Jimenez, can set up a time for you.

Who can I talk to about paying tuition, fees, housing, or health insurance?

All payments can be submitted on the student portal. Edie Millet <studentaccounts@sfbu.edu>, our Bursar, is your go-to person for any billing questions and financial concerns you might have. She oversees the in-person billing process for tuition, fees, housing, and health insurance, and also manages payments from students and families. To schedule a meeting with Edie, visit the Front Desk, where our Front Desk Receptionist, Lesley Jimenez, can set up a time for you.

What about if I'm having trouble with the health insurance provided by SFBU?

There are no representatives from Cigna available at SFBU, so you'll have to call their helpline or consult the documents they sent you. The helpline phone number is on the back of your insurance card. See Edie Millet for more information about your card.

Who should I talk to about financial aid and scholarships?

You can reach out to Manuel Gomez <financialaid@sfbu.edu>, our Associate Director of Financial Aid. He advises students and families on scholarships and financial aid options to help you navigate funding your education.

I have credits that I'd like to transfer from a previous institution. Who should I see?

Keith Sheppard <keith.sheppard@sfbu.edu>, our Transfer Enrollment Counselor, can get you started with this. Then Judy Weng, our Registrar, will take over the process!

Schedule Your Appointment in Advance!
